

#### **Freight Class Key Facts**

- Freight class is an industry-wide system used to categorize commodities.
- Classes are defined by the National Motor Freight Traffic Association (NMFTA).
- Classes are based upon four characteristics: density, stowability, handling and liability.






### NMFC Codes Key Facts

codes identify very specific commodities.

National Motor Freight Classification (NMFC)

- "Bricks," "maple syrup" and every other LTLshippable product has a unique NMFC code.
- Each of these codes corresponds with and are aligned to a freight classification.
- NMFC codes/commodities are assigned to a freight class based upon density and shipping difficulty.





## What do they mean together?

FREIGHT CLASSES
represent criteria
or a standard based
upon four variables of
shipping difficulty.

# NMFC CODES represent commodities that are assigned a class depending on their shipability.

- When together on a bill of lading, the two allow shippers and carriers to evaluate pricing.
- Using both allows everyone to "speak the same language" when it comes to freight costs.
